Coronavirus Death Confirmed At St. Francis

The city of Lynwood has been advised that a woman has died at St. Francis Hospital of the coronavirus (COVID-19). The woman, whose identity hasn't been released by authorities, died shortly after coming to the hospital when she came down ill.

For folks who are not feeling well and think they might have the virus or believe they may have been exposed to the virus , Los Angeles County Public Health recommends that you call 211.

If you are not symptomatic, by all means do not come to the hospital or to your provider.

Remember it is important to practice social distance--stay at least six feet away from other people and frequently wash your hands, keep your hands from face and don't touch surfaces.

No one is immune from CoViD-19, and we don't have a vaccine to treat it. This is a serious public health issue and we must be smart about this and take care of each other.

Muerte de coronavirus confirmado en St. Francis

La ciudad de Lynwood ha sido informada de que una mujer murió en el Hospital St. Francis del coronavirus (COVID-19). La mujer, cuya identidad no ha sido revelada por las autoridades, murió poco después de llegar al hospital cuando ella cayó enferma.

Para las personas que no se sienten bien y piensan que podrían tener el virus o creen que pueden haber estado expuestos al virus, el Departamento de Salud Pública del Condado de Los Angeles recomienda que llamen al 211.

Si no tiene síntomas, no venga al hospital ni a su proveedor.

Recuerde que es importante practicar la distancia social: manténgase al menos a seis pies de distancia de otras personas y lávese las manos con frecuencia, mantenga las manos alejadas de la cara y no toque las superficies.

Nadie es inmune a CoViD-19, y no tenemos una vacuna para tratarlo. Este es un problema grave de salud pública y debemos ser inteligentes al respecto y cuidarnos mutuamente.
